# It began with shade, excitement, and sixty children.

Three and a half years ago, we sat under a tree. One teacher. Fifty curious kids. A question in every eye: Will you stay? We didn't plan to start a structured initiative. We just didn't walk away.

That's how it began—as a one-time class in the forgotten fringes of Gurugram, between high-rises and hard lives. Where every luxury tower casts a long shadow—and in that shadow, you'll find a slum. A child. A chance.

Within a year, we had four centres. All funded by our own pockets and a few kind hearts. Today, we've reached 5,695 children. This year alone—1,700 actively engaged, 1,243 mainstreamed into formal schools.

We also entered construction sites.
Where both parents work. Where kids are left behind. We listened. We adapted.
There were days of joy—zonal sports wins, school awards, a child's first sentence read aloud.

And there were days of heartbreak jhuggis demolished overnight, communities displaced, violence erupting. But here's what never broke: our children's will.

They keep showing up. So we do too.





We're a grassroots team that works in the forgotten lanes of Gurugram the part behind the malls, beyond the skyline.

Where migrant children are left out, left behind, or left alone. We create enabling spaces. Not just to learn—but to grow.

The aim is to create enabling conditions that allow children and women from marginalised communities to live with dignity, respect, and opportunity.

Our mission is to establish informal education centres that offer essential learning opportunities—uplifting children and their families through holistic, community-rooted support.

Our core values are rooted in three words: आत्म विश्वास. आत्म सम्मान. आत्म निर्भरता. (Self-confidence. Self-respect. Self-reliance.)






We started by helping a handful of migrant children. One class. One slum. One moment of care. But the more we looked, the more we saw: this wasn't a crack in the system. It was the system. There are millions of out-of-school children in India.

"Each child is entitled to well-rounded growth, and a life full of opportunities." Some say 10.17 lakhs. Some say 4.47 crores. Pick a number. It's still too many.

Migrant children are among the most vulnerable—always moving, often invisible, and rarely counted. So we made a decision— not to look away. Not to wait. Not to work on the margins, but from them.





# In each community we serve:

- 500 to 1,000 households
- above 90% children are not going to formal schools
- Those who are, often can't read or write

# Why?

- No idea where to go
- No documents
- No support
- Too many children.
- Not enough classrooms.

if we wait another 2–3 years, they miss the bus for good. So we don't wait.

They're growing up too fast.
Earning too soon. Chewing gutkha, talking about marriage, skipping childhood like it was never theirs to begin with. And the hardest part?
They don't always know what they've lost. Because no one ever told them they had a right to more.

Migrant children live in no man's land. They leave village schools behind. Urban ones are out of reach. Documents are missing. So are answers.

Parents don't know where to begin. Children don't even know what they've lost. By 13 or 14, they're earning. Working. Or picking waste for 30 rupees a day. The danger? They grow up without growing. They become invisible. We won't let that happen.

We don't fill gaps. We build bridges."

# We created something simple. But powerful. Dream Big Vidya Kendras. What happens inside?

- Classes for foundational literacy and numeracy (FLN), based on NIPUN Bharat
- Prep using SCERT books to get children back into school
- Support with document creation
- Hand Holding for school admission
- After-school tutoring
- Sports.
- Library time.

# Not all learning fits in a timetable. So we go beyond:

- Sports for strength and well-being
- Quizzes, debates, science exhibitions to spark thinking
- Music, dance, art, craft to nourish creativity
- Body safety and awareness, because safety matters

# OTTO ISSUE LOOKS LIKE

Aneesha walked in speaking only Bengali. No Hindi. No English. No idea what the blackboard meant. She brought her 3-year-old brother with her every day. Even when he cried. Even when he picked fights. She still came. Sat through every

class. Listened, learned, stayed late.

Five months later—

She's reading Hindi storybooks at home. Solving LCM problems in maths. Writing full sentences. And teaching her brother to sit still while she studies. Today, she has cleared her Class 5 open school exams with all A grades.

If she hadn't come, she'd be washing dishes alongside her mother. Or helping her father mix cement.

Instead, she's dreaming of becoming a doctor. Playing kabaddi. And showing up every day—ready to learn, ready to lead.

That's what we call progress. That's what we call power.


